### **EXPECTATIONS FOR MHS ATHLETICS**

#### **Spectator Conduct, Expectations:**

MHS Activities contribute to the physical, social, intellectual, and emotional growth of students. Moreover, these programs foster sportsmanship that accentuates honesty and fair play within the competitive spirit. Positive character traits are developed when students are responsible for leadership, cooperation, and teamwork.

There is thus a great deal of learning, which is occurring. The field of play is an extension of the classroom, with many of the same expectations for student learning. In order for the full amount of student learning to occur, the spectators, both students and adults, must also model the expected behavior.

Mukwonago High School has set the following expectations for spectators at all activities, both home and away.

1. Spectators – home or away: Are an extension of the classrooms of the Mukwonago Area School District. An individual or group who willfully interferes with or interrupts the proper order or management of a public school or sponsored extracurricular event by an act of violence, boisterous conduct, threatening language, unsportsmanlike-like conduct or disobeying of school board policies or administrative rules shall be asked to leave the premises by the school or their designee(s) and may be prohibited from further attendance for a period of time to be determined by the administration. Individuals thus prohibited from attendance may follow established grievance procedures.
2. Spectator conduct at away events: Adults and students represent the Mukwonago Area School District while attending away functions. While in another school's facility we are expected to respect their conduct codes showing courtesy by good sportsmanship at all times.

#### **What administration expects of parents/guardians:**

1. Administration expects parents/guardians to read and support the athletic codes and contracts they and their children sign.
2. Administration expects parents/guardians to be a role model of positive sportsmanship.
3. Administration expects all parents/guardians to attend scheduled organizational meetings of activities in which their child is involved.
4. Administration expects all parents/guardians to go through proper channels of communication to voice concerns and other input about the activity.
5. Administration expects to be treated with consideration, professional courtesy, integrity, and respect.
